Supporting Asbury Woods with a Qualified Charitable Distribution



Bob Howden became familiar with Asbury Woods shortly after moving to Erie in 1986. "I became active in the Lake Erie Chapter of the Sierra Club, and they held their meetings at Asbury Woods" he said. "After I retired, I decided I wanted to volunteer in the community and started volunteering at Asbury Woods." Bob's involvement and commitment to the organization resulted in him being asked to join the Asbury Woods' Board of Directors in 2018, a seat which he still holds.

When asked why Asbury Woods is important to him, Bob replied "What's important to me is protecting the environment, especially undeveloped land. Once you "pave paradise" for whatever reason, you don't get it back." Bob also highlighted the importance of Asbury Woods' educational programs. "If you are going to teach future generations the value of environmental preservation, you need concrete examples of such efforts. Asbury Woods is such an example."

In terms of his financial support, this year Bob was able to join Asbury Woods' Grandfather Tree Society by making a gift utilizing a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) from his individual retirement account (IRA). A qualified charitable distribution is a distribution from your IRA to a qualified charity such as Asbury Woods. A QCD is not taxed, nor is it included in your taxable income. QCDs can be made from a traditional IRA or a Roth IRA, but there is no tax benefit to making a QCD from a Roth IRA because distributions are already tax free.

"Using a QCD as a donation tool was a no-brainer," Bob said. "I reduce my taxable income and provide funds to support a non-profit that does wonderful work." He continued, "QCDs offer a straightforward giving process. All I had to do was contact my IRA Administrator and request that a distribution be made directly to Asbury Woods [EIN: 26-0699998]. Then I notified the Asbury Woods staff of my QCD donation."

"Taking a walk along the trails and appreciating the sounds of nature, to me is priceless. Asbury Woods provides the people of the Erie region with a way to escape from the hustle and bustle of everyday life. During the nine years I've been a volunteer here, I've met many people who are visiting Asbury Woods for the first time. They are always amazed at what they see, the programs we offer and the things we do. I wish everyone in the region would visit Asbury Woods to experience it firsthand."

Many individuals who are required to take money from their IRA but do not need it for living expenses have chosen to make QCDs from their IRA to support the work of Asbury Woods. 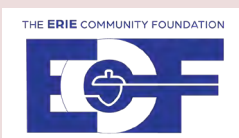

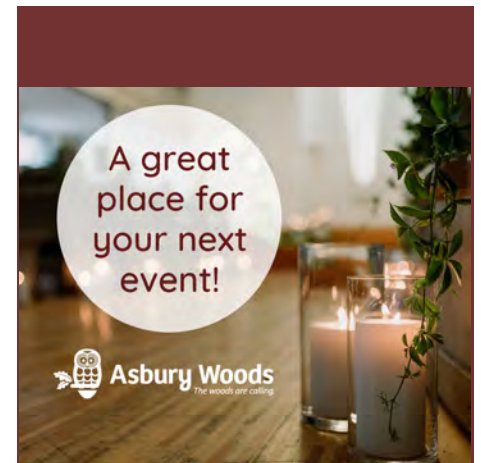

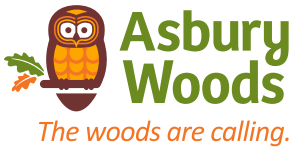


Take a Plant, Leave a Plant
