# ASBURY WOODS | The Year of Wildlife

This year marks the third year that Asbury Woods has a year-long theme for our programs and outreach activities, helping us to take a deeper look at various environmental and conservation topics as we pursue our vision for Northwestern Pennsylvania to be a place where appreciation for and protection of natural places is a deeply held personal and community value.

The Year of Wildlife is an opportunity to focus on animal species native to Pennsylvania. Pennsylvania has a rich diversity of habitat which allows an incredible array of wildlife to thrive across the State. This year we'll look into our own backyards, surrounding forests, fields, wetlands, lakes, and streams to discover the wildlife that surrounds us.

Amongst Asbury Woods 234 acres of property alone, you can discover 344 species of wildlife (as documented on iNaturalist and eBird as of May 2023)! That means 140 bird species, 123 varieties of insects, 10 mammals and more have been spotted and identified within our borders. Several threatened species and species of concern are found at Asbury Woods, including a rare butterfly, the Baltimore Checkerspot, found during a 2022 field survey.

Jennifer Farrar, Executive Director, commented, "While learning about exotic animals in far-off places can seem more exciting than thinking about native species, a year-long focus on native wildlife is an opportunity to raise awareness about local and regional conservation issues. We hope it sparks curiosity about the natural world and encourages people to protect local habitat for the amazing variety of animal life that calls Pennsylvania home."

In addition to programming and educational content, a key component of the Year of Wildlife will be a year-long exhibit in the Nature Center, **Wild About Wildlife!** *Discovering Pennsylvania's Native Species*. The exhibit will feature taxidermy specimens, interactive stations, and hands-on learning. Each month a different animal will be highlighted, starting with the Great Horned Owl in February.

# You Can't Retire From Being Amazing!

Asbury Woods will be a little different in 2025. Longtime Millcreek Township School District Environmental Education Coordinator, Steve Wasiesky, has retired after 55 years of combined service and work at MTSD and Asbury Woods. Steve's connection with Asbury Woods started at age 11 when he visited for a 5th grade field trip. He also attended camp and as a teen worked here during the summers. Those early years led Steve to realize his passion for environmental education.

Steve received his Bachelor of Science degree in Biology and Secondary Education Certificates in Biology & Chemistry at Edinboro University. He had a 20 year career in the Chemical Divisions Coatings Technical Service



Lab at LORD Corporation before transitioning to a full-time role at Asbury Woods in 1999. He's been "Mr. Steve" ever since! During his decades at Asbury Woods, Steve has served as an educator, mentor, executive director, fundraiser, nature center expansion coordinator, grant writer, and all-around cheerleader! If there's a question about Asbury Woods, Steve has the answer!

The impact that Steve has had on environmental education throughout his career is astonishing. Not only has he educated tens of thousands of Millcreek Township students over the years, but he's had a major impact on environmental education across the state. Steve has been involved with Pennsylvania Association of Environmental Educators (PAEE) since 1979, including serving on the board of directors from 2010-2021, and as president from 2018-2020. He currently serves on several



regional and state level committees, including the Content and Writing Committees for the new Pennsylvania Science Technology Engineering Environmental Literacy and Sustainability (STEELS) Academic Standards.

When asked what he was most proud of during his career, Steve stated, "Explorer Post




and teaching." Explorer Post was a career development program for youth ages 14-21. "You don't know what impact you make but you can see the careers Post members have had," he continued. Steve shared that those careers in education and science show the impact of being at Asbury Woods. "They are taking what they learn and doing it!" Most of the Post members have gone on to careers in education or science and they often reconnect with Steve to share their accomplishments.

"Steve's impact on environmental education in our region cannot be understated. It has been an honor to work with and learn from him. We look forward to carrying forth his passion and vision, and hopefully we will see him frequently!" shared Director of Education, Sarah Bennett.

Steve's lifelong dedication to Environmental Education has not gone unnoticed. He was awarded the 1975 Natural Science for Youth Foundation's Henry



Gund Junior Staff Achievement Award, 2010 Environmental Educator of the Year Award from the Pennsylvania Association of Environmental Educators (PAEE), and the 2022 PAEE Keystone Award, which recognizes an educator who has dedicated their life to advancing the quality and opportunity for environmental education in Pennsylvania.
